*A Jr./Jr. Member can earn any stage tag if they are capable of completing the relevant evaluations.

Age Range: 6 - 12 years old

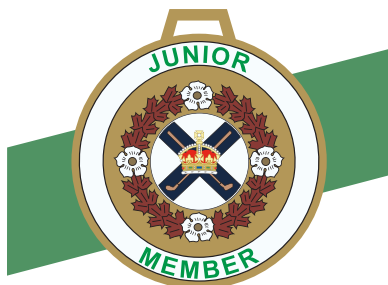
Focus: Introduction to golf fundamentals, basic techniques, and course etiquette.

REQUIREMENTS:

Evaluation: Participants will be assessed based on their basic golf skills, amounts of games and lesson programs attended, understanding of etiquette, and ability to play from the Royal Tees.

Must complete Orange Tag Evaluation to earn a "Orange Tag." Evaluation books will be provided and will be the golfers responsibility to bring to practice, camps, evaluations, events, and any club related activity that may earn marks towards their "Red Tag".

Playing allowances/restrictions: After 2pm daily, after the lottery, and at the end of the draw if there are events (No Exceptions). Immediate family are welcomed to play as guests, no other guests allowed. Must have a chaperone on the golf course if playing alone. Allowed to play in club related junior events (Jr. Night, Junior Club Championships etc.).



GREEN TAG EVALUATION Junior

Age Range: 12 - 18 years old

Focus: Introduction to golf fundamentals, basic techniques, and course etiquette.

REQUIREMENTS:

Evaluation: Participants will be assessed based on their basic golf skills, quantity of games and lesson programs attended, understanding of etiquette, and ability to play from the green tees or Royal Tees.

Must complete Green Tag Evaluation to earn a "Green Tag." Evaluation books will be provided and will be the golfers responsibility to bring to practice, camps, evaluations, events, and any club related activity that may earn marks towards their "Red Tag." Green tag members can challenge the "Red Tag" evaluation. *

** As a new member this individual may show an already strong foundation for the game, and can prove an active and accurate handicap, and display golf skills that coincide with the evaluation process.*

Playing allowances/restrictions: After 2pm daily, after the lottery, and at the end of the draw if there are events (No exceptions). Immediate family are welcomed to play as guests, no other guests allowed. Allowed to play in club related junior events (Jr. Night, Junior Club Championships etc.).



RED TAG EVALUATION

Age Range: 6 - 18 years old

Focus: Advancing golf skills, introducing competition, Etiquette/Rules and learning to play under pressure.

REQUIREMENTS:

Evaluation: Participants will be assessed based on their advancing golf skills, quantity of games and lesson programs attended, understanding of etiquette and rules, and the ability to play from the green tees or royal tees. This individual will have a perfect handicap record.

Must complete Red Tag Evaluation to earn a "Red Tag." Evaluation books will be provided and will be the golfers responsibility to bring to practice, camps, evaluations, events, and any club related activity that may earn marks towards their "Blue Tag".

Playing allowances/restrictions: After 2pm daily, after the lottery (no exceptions), guests are welcomed; up to 2 guests at a time. Allowed to play in club related junior events (Jr. Night, Junior Club Championships etc.).



BLUE TAG EVALUATION

Age Range: 10 - 18 years old

Focus: Preparing for high school and local competition, developing a strategic approach to the game, and improving mental resilience.

REQUIREMENTS:

Evaluation: Participants will be assessed based on their advancing golf skills, quantity of games and lesson programs attended, ability to prepare for a competition, playing in local and regional competitions, complete understanding of etiquette, understanding of major relevant tournament rules, and the ability to play from the white tees, green tees, or royal tees (this individual may play further back if the head professional agrees to sign their book giving them the option based on skill). This individual will have a perfect handicap record.

Must complete Blue Tag Evaluation to earn a "Blue Tag." Evaluation books will be provided and will be the golfers responsibility to bring to practice, camps, evaluations, events, and any club related activity that may earn marks towards their "Silver Tag."

Playing allowances/restrictions: After 2pm daily, after the lottery, may play before 2pm on the day of play if the host golf professional agrees to the tee time being acceptable. Guests are welcomed; up to 2 guests at a time. Allowed to play in club related junior events (Jr. Night, Junior Club Championships etc.). This individual may be considered for team events.



SILVER TAG EVALUATION

Age Range: 10 - 18 years old

Focus: High-level training and practice, competition, and preparation for potential high-school, regional, and national golf competitions. Representing Royal Colwood Golf Club in any event.

REQUIREMENTS:

Evaluation: Participants will be assessed on their high level golf skills, quantity of games and lesson programs attended, ability to prepare for a competition, playing in local, regional, and potentially national competitions, help with; orange, green, red and blue tagged golfers to learn etiquette and course care, clear understanding of the rules of golf, and the ability to play from any tee location. This individual will have a perfect handicap record.

Must complete Silver Tag Evaluations to earn a "Silver Tag." Evaluation books will be provided and will be the golfers responsibility to bring to practice, camps, evaluations, events, and any club related activity that may earn marks towards their "Gold Tag."

Playing allowances/Restrictions:

Access to the tee sheet at any time after the lottery process (6 days in advance), access 6 days in advance is for personal use only. Guest bookings can be made on the day of play. Allowed to play in junior related events, This individual will be strongly considered for team events.



GOLD TAG EVALUATION

Age Range: 12 - 18 years old

This member has shown professionalism, determination, success in golf events, contributes to the success of other junior golfers, and displays a rapport with the members of Royal Colwood Golf Club.

REQUIREMENTS:

Evaluation: Upon completion of the gold tag evaluation this member will be required to sit with the Head Professional and General Manager to receive the "Gold Tag"

A maximum of 4 gold tag members, at any given time. If a junior golfer completes the gold tag evaluation and there are already 4 gold tag members, that junior golfer will have to wait until

- i. One of the 4 gold tag members age out (turns 19 years old)
- ii. A gold tag member leaves the club.

This junior member is now considered a Full access member

- i. May enter the lottery for tee times.
- ii. Can invite guests as full play members do, with the restriction of after the lottery and approved by professional staff.
- iii. Considered for bursary/scholarship.
- iv. First choice for any team related events.

ORANGE TAG EVALUATION FOR JUNIOR CATEGORY

Evaluation:

Participants will be assessed based on their basic golf skills, number of games and lesson programs attended, understanding of etiquette, and ability to play from the Royal Tees.

Rules of Golf:

- Complete on-course "rules evaluation"
- R&A Rules level one. (Available online)

Complete rules evaluation stage 1:

Testing to be done under coach supervision.

Parents may help if reading/writing isn't developed yet.

Etiquette:

- 15 minutes with coach learning to rake a bunker.
- 15 minutes learning to fix ball marks.
- 15 minutes on the short game range fixing divots.
- 15 minutes learning about flag stick and pushcart etiquette.
- Must have items to start your round.

Being a member:

Complete 30 minute being a member course.

GOLF SKILL

- Strike a golf ball 3 times in a row, higher than a flagstick.

- Putt a golf ball in the hole 10 times in a row from 2 feet, no misses.

- Pitch/Chip the ball inside a 3-foot circle 2 times out of 10 shots.

- Hit your driver more than 60 yards.

GOLF & PRACTICE

- Play 15 nine-hole rounds from the Royal (orange) tee and mark scores in handicap computer.

Complete rules evaluation stage 1:

Testing to be done under coach supervision. Parents may help if reading/writing isn't developed yet.

Etiquette:

- 15 minutes with coach learning to rake a bunker.
- 15 minutes learning to fix ball marks.
- 15 minutes on the short game range fixing divots.
- 15 minutes learning about flag stick and pushcart etiquette.
- Must have items to start your round.

Being a member:

Complete 30 minute being a member course.

- Strike a golf ball 5 times in a row, higher than a flagstick. _____
- Putt a golf ball in the hole 10 times in a row from 3 feet, no misses. _____
